Reflection on the Reading


This Sunday we break from our reading of Matthew's Gospel (the primary Gospel for our current liturgical cycle, Cycle A) to read from the Gospel of John. Last week, we heard about Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist. Today, we hear John the Baptist's own testimony about who Jesus is. John the Baptist announces that he knows Jesus is the Son of God.

John the Baptist's sense of purpose is clearly identified in this reading: he baptized in order to prepare for and make known the ministry of the One who was to follow. John's witness is an excellent example of what it means to be a disciple. By our Baptism, we are called to make Jesus known to all the world by our words and by the witness of our lives.

Carta del Párroco

Queridos amigos en el Señor,

El año pasado, por estas fechas, vimos la toma de posesión de un nuevo presidente y rezamos por la unidad y la paz en el nuevo año... Pongo aquí lo que escribí el año pasado en mi carta para el segundo domingo del tiempo ordinario, pues creo que probablemente sigue siendo relevante para nosotros hoy en día:

¿Cómo nos han ayudado el Adviento y la Navidad a prepararnos para los tiempos difíciles que se avecinan, ahora que los resultados de las elecciones de noviembre se reflejan en la vida cotidiana de la gente común? ¿Somos capaces de llevar con nosotros la alegría, la esperanza y la paz de la Navidad en el momento presente? ¿Cómo nos seguirán desafiando y consolando las historias del niño acostado en un pesebre y de la Sagrada Familia huyendo a Egipto en este nuevo año?

Esta semana comenzará con la celebración del Día de Martin Luther King Jr. y terminará con la Marcha por la Vida en Washington, D.C. Conscientes de la larga tradición que se refleja en la Doctrina Social de la Iglesia que afirma que la dignidad de toda vida humana desde la concepción hasta la muerte natural, a los católicos se nos invita a tomar en serio el mensaje de no violencia promovido tanto por el movimiento por la justicia racial como por el movimiento para proteger la dignidad de la vida en el útero. Sin duda, no hay respuestas fáciles a estas complejas cuestiones que han dividido a nuestro país y a nuestra Iglesia. Es por eso que tenemos que seguir trabajando duro para discernir cómo promover el bien común en un mundo lleno de problemas. Nosotros, fieles católicos, contamos con el don de una larga tradición de enseñanza social y discernimiento que debemos estudiar y practicar al enfrentar las numerosas cuestiones morales que se nos plantearán en los días, meses y años venideros.

Comprométamonos a hacer lo que nos corresponde y a no caer en la trampa de creer que los medios de comunicación y los algoritmos de las redes sociales nos mantendrán adecuadamente informados. Los católicos sabemos que la vida es más compleja y matizada de lo que los medios de comunicación populares intentan sugerir, ya que se benefician al mantenernos aislados, enfurecidos y divididos. Nosotros somos amigos de Dios y estamos llamados a ser personas de oración y acción no violenta por la justicia, inspiradas por el Príncipe de la Paz que nació en un pesebre, murió en una cruz y resucitó de entre los muertos. El mismo que, ya resucitado, permanece presente en el mundo y nos dice: "La paz esté con ustedes".

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in the Lord,

Last year at this time we were watching the inauguration of a new president and praying for unity and peace in the new year. Here's what I wrote last year in my pastor's letter for the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time. I think it's probably still relevant for us today:

How have the seasons of Advent and Christmas helped to prepare us for the challenging times ahead as the results of the November election now play out in the everyday lives of ordinary people? Can we remember to bring the joy, hope, and peace of the Christmas season with us into the present moment? How will the stories of the infant lying in a manger and the Holy Family fleeing to Egypt continue to challenge and console us in this new year?

This week will begin with the observance of Martin Luther King Jr. Day and end with the March for Life in Washington DC. Informed by our long tradition of Catholic social teaching which insists on the dignity of all human life from conception to natural death, we Catholics are encouraged to take seriously the message of non-violence promoted by both the movement for racial justice and the movement to protect the dignity of life in the womb. There are no easy answers to these complex issues that have divided our country and our Church. We need to keep doing the hard work of discerning how to promote the common good in a complicated world. We Catholics have been given the gift of a long tradition of social teaching and discernment that we need to study and practice as we face the many moral issues that will present themselves in the days, months, and years ahead.

Let's commit to doing our homework and not falling into the trap of thinking that cable news networks and social media algorithms will keep us adequately informed. We Catholics know that life is more complicated and nuanced than popular media outlets try to suggest as they turn a profit by keeping us siloed, enraged, and divided. We are friends of God. We are called to be prayerful people of non-violent action for justice inspired by the Prince of Peace who was born in a manger, died on a cross, and rose from the dead with the words "Peace be with you" forever on the lips of his risen body alive and present in the world.






