A Letter from Fr. Joe and the Parish Pastoral Council

Dear Parishioners,

Close to 100 years ago, the Archdiocese of Boston established our territorial parish, located at Boston College to be staffed by the Jesuits of the then New England Province. Since its very beginning, our parish has had a partnership with BC while standing as a separate canonical entity (i.e., not a university chapel) with responsibilities to serve our parishioners and the archdiocese. Our parish's location on the edge of the university campus has necessitated our close, mutually beneficial cooperation. Over the past several years there has been a deepening partnership between our parish and Boston College. The benefits to the parish range from collaboration on spiritual and educational endeavors to help with parish facilities and operations. With the support of the Jesuit Provincial, the pastoral leadership of St. Ignatius Parish and Boston College have opened discussions to explore deepening the partnership we already enjoy and bringing it to a new stage.

From our perspective we, the Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) and Fr. Joe, believe much can be gained by expanding the relationship with BC. We envision that deeper interaction with the resources of this world class Jesuit university may provide better opportunities for the parish to leverage our resources to advance our understanding of and impact on critical issues (e.g., greater outreach to the poor in Boston, collaboration on environmental and justice issues, advocacy in favor of immigrants and against racism, etc.). We imagine the possibility of further enriching the parish community by opening more connections across both the parish and the university to offer unique and diverse spiritual and intergenerational opportunities. We hope that the witness of the parish's robust and diverse parishioners, dedicated to the Catholic faith, would have a more direct impact on the formation of generations of BC students. We also see the financial strength of BC could provide new options for our community, including upgrades to our facilities. Although the parish has been able to attend to the ongoing maintenance of the buildings, it is obvious that significant capital repairs or improvements have been well beyond our reach. Major repairs to the church's stonework and foundation would help us ensure the beauty of our worship space. As well, the potential addition of space for offices, meeting areas and other facilities would provide dearly needed spaces for faith formation and other parish activities. These are just some of the opportunities a reimagined partnership might afford; we are excited to hear what additional ideas the broader parish community might suggest as this process advances.

Though we are very early in the discussions, we believe the university's interest in this enhanced partnership is two-fold. First, BC would like to care for and upgrade the parish's physical plant. Besides maintaining a vital worship space, currently used by both the parish and the university, Boston College would like to invest in an upgrade to the buildings that



Estimados Feligreses,

Hace casi 100 años, la Arquidiócesis de Boston estableció nuestra parroquia territorial, ubicada en Boston College para ser atendida por los jesuitas de la entonces Provincia de Nueva Inglaterra. Desde sus inicios, nuestra parroquia ha tenido una asociación con BC mientras se mantiene como una entidad canónica separada (es decir, no una capilla universitaria) con responsabilidades para servir a nuestros feligreses y a la arquidiócesis. La ubicación de nuestra parroquia en el borde del campus universitario ha requerido nuestra cooperación cercana y mutuamente beneficiosa. En los últimos años ha habido una asociación cada vez más profunda entre nuestra parroquia y Boston College. Los beneficios para la parroquia van desde la colaboración en esfuerzos espirituales y educativos hasta ayudar con las instalaciones y operaciones de la parroquia. Con el apoyo del Provincial Jesuita, el liderazgo pastoral de la Parroquia de San Ignacio y el de Boston College han abierto discusiones para explorar la profundización de la asociación que ya disfrutamos y llevarla a una nueva etapa.

Desde nuestra perspectiva, nosotros, el Consejo Pastoral Parroquial (PPC) y el P. Joe, creemos que se puede ganar mucho expandiendo la relación con BC. Imaginamos que una interacción más profunda con los recursos de esta universidad jesuita de clase mundial puede proporcionar mejores oportunidades para que la parroquia aproveche nuestros recursos para avanzar en nuestra comprensión e impacto en temas críticos (por ejemplo, un mayor alcance a los pobres en Boston, colaboración en temas ambientales y de justicia, defensa a favor de los inmigrantes y contra el racismo, etc.). Imaginamos la posibilidad de enriquecer aún más a la comunidad parroquial abriendo más conexiones tanto en la parroquia como en la universidad para ofrecer oportunidades espirituales e intergeneracionales únicas y diversas. Esperamos que el testimonio de los feligreses fuertes y diversos de la parroquia, dedicados a la fe católica, tenga un impacto más directo en la formación de generaciones de estudiantes de BC. También vemos que la fortaleza financiera de BC podría proporcionar nuevas opciones para nuestra comunidad, incluidas las actualizaciones de nuestras instalaciones. Aunque la parroquia ha podido atender el mantenimiento continuo de los edificios, es obvio que las reparaciones o mejoras capitales significativas han estado fuera de nuestro alcance. Las reparaciones importantes en la piedra y los cimientos de la iglesia nos ayudarían a garantizar la belleza de nuestro espacio de culto. Además, la posible adición de un espacio para oficinas, áreas de reunión y otras instalaciones proporcionarían espacios muy necesarios para la formación en la fe y otras actividades parroquiales. Estas son solo algunas de las oportunidades que ofrece una asociación reimaginada; estamos entusiasmados de escuchar qué ideas adicionales podría sugerir la comunidad parroquial en general a medida que avanza este proceso.

serve as the “gateway” to their vibrant and growing Jesuit university. Second, BC realizes that a deeper engagement with a robust parish community like ours would enrich student formation and the wider BC community.

Yet bringing any relationship to a new stage requires discernment and care. It is important that the outcome is mutually beneficial, and that neither party sacrifices what is most important to them. We, the PPC and Fr. Joe, are committed to parishioners representing the parish in formalizing the partnership. To that end, we have identified five parishioners who will serve as a team representing the parish in talks with a team of five from the university. The members of the parish's team are: Elsa Janairo, Pete Levangie, Denny Martin, Reenie Murphy, and Rita Rodriguez. Short bios of each can be found below.

At this time, discussions between the two teams are only just beginning. We are mindful of both your likely desires for communication from us as well as our need to have your input concerning this partnership. In the months ahead, we will use different modes to share information and solicit your input. We are eager to know what you hold most dear about St. Ignatius Parish. Knowing your hopes and dreams, your fears and concerns, will be essential as we move forward in our deliberations on behalf of the parish.


Aunque estamos muy al principio de las discusiones, creamos que el interés de la universidad en esta asociación mejorada es doble. Primero, BC desea cuidar y mejorar la planta física de la parroquia. En los próximos meses, utilizaremos diferentes modos para compartir información y solicitar su opinión. Estamos ansiosos por saber lo que más aprecian de la Parroquia de San Ignacio. We will return to in person classes when it is safe to do so.




