### THE WORK OF CHRISTMAS by Howard Thurman

When the song of the angels is stilled,  
When the star in the sky is gone,  
When the kings and princes are home,  
When the shepherds are back with their flock,  
The work of Christmas begins:

To find the lost,  
To heal the broken,  
To feed the hungry,  
To release the prisoner,  
To rebuild the nations,  
To bring peace among brothers,  
To make music in the heart.

## Reflection on the Reading

The word Epiphany means “manifestation” or “showing forth.” An epiphany is a revelation, the divine making itself known to humankind. Several moments in Christ's early life and ministry have been celebrated as his “epiphanies”: his birth in Bethlehem, the visit of the Magi, his baptism by John, and his first miracle at Cana.

**Today's feast is about the many ways in which God has shown more about who God is, especially through the incarnation of Christ.** What are some of these moments for you, personally? Maybe a moment of close, intimate prayer. Perhaps something you learned in school that changed the way you thought about the world. Maybe the way your parents love you. Maybe the epiphany comes with the gratitude we feel when someone we love, who has been suffering for a long time, finally goes to God. Maybe a simple cup of coffee or meal with a friend you've known for a long time. Sometimes it's a nice walk in the woods or the beach, or enjoying life in a great metropolis.

These moments—these moments of spending time with people of faith, even people we may not know—these are epiphanies. They show us that the miracle of God becoming human is the real deal. And they remind us that we, too, can be epiphanies to other people.

As we enter into the new year, let's all try to be little epiphanies, revelations of God's presence and love in the world.
