From the Desk of the Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

At a recent board retreat for Loyola University, Baltimore I had the privilege of offering the kickoff talk about the Jesuit Universal Apostolic Preferences to my fellow trustees.

In my talk, I explained how the Preferences came to be, pointing out that it all began with a collaborative discernment process in 2017 involving Jesuits from around the world along with their lay apostolic partners reflecting upon the simple question of where we see the call of Christ today. All this data was then collected and during a retreat with Fr. General, Arturo Sosa, and his Jesuit leadership advisors, the four preferences emerged:

1. To show the way to God through the Spiritual Exercises and discernment;
2. To walk with the poor, the outcasts of the world, those whose dignity has been violated, in a mission of reconciliation and justice;
3. To accompany young people in the creation of a hope-filled future;
4. To collaborate in the care of our Common Home.

These were then sent to the Holy Father, Pope Francis, for approval. The reason for sending them to him is that the Pope gives us our mission. So, the four preferences were then received back from him as a mission, to begin in 2019 and progress for the next 10 years.

I suspect you can see that this way of proceeding has all the marks of the synodal process we are engaging in as Church and parish community. Praying, listening, and sharing with one another will help us discern together where the Spirit is leading us.

As a parish community, I do hope many of you intend or were already able to gather on Zoom or in the Lannon Chapel to participate in one of our synodal inspired Pastoral Council's listening sessions about the possible future enhanced partnership with Boston College. As Fr. Leahy, the president of Boston College, recently wrote to me in an email:

I believe that BC/St. Ignatius together can do more and be an even greater force for renewing parish life and the pastoral/intellectual heritage of the Church.

I share his "magis" (the greater, the more) belief here too and have great hopes for such a partnership. The journey will not be without its little hiccups and challenges of course. But if we have love for one another, as we hear Jesus summon us in this weekend's Gospel, we will work these out.

In concluding my talk about the preferences, I suggested we remember three C's as we continue to journey together on the retreat and in working together in the years ahead: collaboration, consciousness and conversion. By collaborating we come to a new consciousness and with a new consciousness, we arrive at conversion.

Estimados Feligreses:

En un reciente retiro de la junta directiva de la Universidad Loyola, Baltimore, tuve el privilegio de ofrecer la charla inicial sobre las Preferencias Apostólicas Universales Jesuitas a mis compañeros fideicomisarios.

En mi charla, expliqué cómo surgieron las Preferencias, señalando que todo comenzó con un proceso de discernimiento colaborativo en 2017 que involucró a jesuitas de todo el mundo junto con sus socios apostólicos laicos, reflexionando sobre la simple pregunta de dónde vemos el llamado de Cristo hoy. Todos estos datos fueron recogidos y durante un retiro con el P. General, Arturo Sosa, y sus consejeros de liderazgo jesuita surgieron las cuatro preferencias:

1. Mostrar el camino a Dios a través de los Ejercicios Espirituales y el discernimiento;
2. Caminar con los pobres, los marginados del mundo, aquellos cuya dignidad ha sido violada, en una misión de reconciliación y justicia;
3. Acompañar a los jóvenes en la creación de un futuro lleno de esperanza;
4. Colaborar en el cuidado de nuestra Casa Común.

Estos fueron enviados al Santo Padre, el Papa Francisco, para su aprobación. La razón para enviárselos es que el Papa nos da nuestra misión. Por lo tanto, las cuatro preferencias fueron devueltas por él como una misión, comenzando en 2019 y progresando durante los próximos 10 años.

Sospecho que pueden ver que esta forma de proceder tiene todas las marcas del proceso sinodal en el que estamos participando como Iglesia y comunidad parroquial. Orar, escuchar y compartir unos con otros nos ayudará a discernir juntos a dónde nos está guiando el Espíritu.

Como comunidad parroquial, espero que muchos de ustedes tengan la intención o ya hayan podido reunirse en Zoom o en la Capilla Lannon para participar en una de las sesiones de escucha de nuestro Consejo Pastoral inspirado en el sínodo sobre la posible asociación futura mejorada con Boston College. Como el P. Leahy, el presidente de Boston College, me escribió recientemente en un correo electrónico:

Creo que BC / San Ignacio juntos pueden hacer más y ser una fuerza aún mayor para renovar la vida parroquial y el patrimonio pastoral/intellectual de la Iglesia.

Comparto su creencia "magis" (cuanto mayor, más) aquí también y tengo grandes esperanzas en tal asociación. El viaje no estará exento de pequeños contratiempos y desafíos, por supuesto. Pero si nos amamos unos a otros, al escuchar a Jesús convocarnos en el Evangelio de este fin de semana, los resolveremos.

Al concluir mi charla sobre las preferencias, sugerí que recordáramos tres C a medida que continuamos viajando juntos



I offer these now to you for I can think of no better way than through these three C's to embody and celebrate the theme of this Ignatian year ending on his feast day on July 31st: "to see all things new in Christ."

In this Easter season, inspired by our Gospel, may our love for one another in Christ help us to grow in wisdom and grace, in an openness and trust, so that all will know we are his disciples.





Retreatants commit to:


- Daily Prayer


