Reflection on the Readings

Respect Life Sunday

Faith gives us the ability to hope. The example of the apostles in the Gospel encourages us to ask God Himself to "increase our faith." If we struggle to find the courage to speak boldly about human life, we shouldn't be ashamed. The apostles—who themselves lived, ate, and prayed with Christ— needed God's grace to carry out Christ's saving mission. We needn't be afraid to ask God to increase our faith. For if we have but "faith the size of a mustard seed," Christ can give us the power to do incredible things in service of the Gospel.

Amid the increasing attacks on the value of human life, we know that "we are firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear, and death." As we recommit ourselves to upholding the teachings of the Church on the inviolability of human life, we recall that the gift of life that God has granted to us is indeed a sign of hope.

World Day of Migrants and Refugees

Good Lord and Heavenly Father, You love each one of your children regardless of the lands they come from.

We thank you for helping us to recognize each other as members of the same human family and as your beloved people.

We thank you because you enlighten us, encourage us, and feed us with your Word.

Carta del Párroco

Queridos amigos en el Señor:

No, no es un engaño, el cambio climático es real. Si alguno de ustedes siguió las sesiones de la Asamblea General de la ONU la semana pasada, es posible que haya escuchado a alguien tratando de convencernos de que el cambio climático es "la mayor estafa jamás perpetrada contra el mundo". Por mi parte, estoy profundamente agradecido por los esfuerzos de nuestro Equipo Verde de la parroquia para educarnos sobre esta crisis para que no caigamos en las ideas de aquellos que quieren seguir explotando la creación de Dios para su propio beneficio personal y político. A través de su perseverancia y su ejemplo de oración, nuestro Equipo Verde parroquial nos ha inspirado a todos a estudiar y abrazar las enseñanzas de la Iglesia sobre esta crisis, que es social y medioambiental. El papa Francisco dijo muchas veces que nuestro objetivo debe ser restablecer el equilibrio entre ricos y pobres, entre la humanidad y el mundo natural.

Me parece muy apropiado que el Tiempo de la Creación sea el preámbulo del Mes del Respeto a la Vida. En un excelente artículo sobre la encíclica del Papa sobre el cuidado de la casa común, publicado por Anthony Annett en 2015, el autor Anthony Annett dice: "Laudato Si' vincula el aborto con un conjunto más amplio de preocupaciones relacionadas con la dignidad humana y la protección de la tierra. Según lo entiende la Iglesia, el desarrollo sostenible es provida: se basa en la dignidad de cada persona humana y busca crear las condiciones previas para el florecimiento humano» (Revista Commonweal, 7 de julio de 2015). Este fin de semana, en cada una de las misas programadas, escucharemos reflexiones preparadas y presentadas por miembros de nuestro Equipo Verde parroquial. Espero que su pasión por la dignidad y la protección de toda vida nos inspire a todos a asumir este gran desafío de nuestro tiempo.

Por último, este domingo también es la Jornada Mundial del Migrante y del Refugiado. Nuestro comité parroquial de inmigración ha preparado una presentación con testimonios de inmigrantes y personas que trabajan con ellos. No dejen de acompañarnos en el sótano de la parroquia el 5 de octubre a las 11:30 a. m. Demos gracias a Dios por el don de la vida, la belleza de la creación y nuestra llamada bautismal a defender y proteger la dignidad de toda vida.

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in the Lord,

It's not a hoax. Climate change is real. But if you were following the general assembly meetings at the United Nations last week, you might have heard someone trying to convince us that climate change is "the biggest conjob ever perpetrated upon the world." I'm deeply grateful for the efforts of our parish Green Team to educate us about this serious issue so that we don't fall prey to those who want to continue exploiting God's gift of creation for their own personal profit and political gain. Through their persistence and prayerful example, our parish Green Team has inspired all of us to study and embrace the teaching of our Church on this complex crisis that is both social and environmental. Pope Francis said repeatedly that our goal should be to restore balance—between the rich and the poor, between humanity and the natural world.

I think it's appropriate that the Season of Creation leads into Respect Life Month. In his excellent 2015 article analyzing Pope Francis' recently promulgated encyclical, Anthony Annett says, "Laudato Si' links abortion to a broader set of concerns related to human dignity and protection of the earth. As understood by the church, sustainable development is pro-life: it is predicated on the dignity of every human person and seeks to create the preconditions for human flourishing" (Commonweal, July 7, 2015). This weekend, at each of the scheduled Masses, we will hear reflections prepared and presented by members of our parish Green Team. I hope their passion for the dignity and protection of all life will inspire all of us to take up this great challenge of our time.

This Sunday also happens to be the Vatican's World Day of Migrants and Refugees. Our parish Immigration Committee has prepared a presentation of testimonials from immigrants and people who work with immigrants. Be sure to join us in the Friary Room on October 5 at 11:30am to hear their stories. Let's all be grateful to God for the gift of life, the beauty of creation, and our baptismal call to uphold and defend the dignity of all life.

Catholic Social Teaching



What does our faith in Jesus Christ have to do with peace, justice, and reconciliation? We know that the Kingdom of God is already among us and that its final fulfillment will come about through God. Our work to embody the Kingdom is a cooperation with the God who is Love and who continues to draw us into abundant life.

One way that the Catholic Church has conceptualized our cooperation with God is Catholic Social Teaching (CST), the collection of official teachings on matters of public life, politics, society, and economics. Through CST, the Church seeks to enact the justice and peace of the Kingdom of God which we have through faith in Christ. CST proclaims good news: that God, working through us and in us as the Eucharistic Body of Christ, will protect the vulnerable, feed the hungry, and lift up the oppressed!

CST is often analyzed and explained in the seven basic themes or principles above, but this rich teaching is more than a set of bullet points or policy recommendations. At its best, CST offers a vision of human happiness and flourishing. Catholic Social Teaching is a way of proceeding that reveals the image of God shining through human community.

CST sees humans as rational, spiritual, and social. It sees our fulfillment in God and with other people. For that reason, justice and peace are not reducible to economic or political progress, but instead pursue the *cura personalis*, the full and authentic development of the full human person and the full human community. CST invites us to follow Jesus' example in the service of his people.


