Carta del Párroco

Queridos amigos en el Señor:

Me gustaría agradecer a todos nuestros cantores, coros y músicos que han trabajado duro durante este Mes de la Historia Afro para guiarnos en la oración con canciones de la tradición musical de los hermanos afroamericanos esclavizados. Las espiritualidades afro, que han formado parte de nuestras liturgias durante el mes de febrero, honran la historia de la opresión, la lucha, la fe y los logros que los afros han experimentado a lo largo de varios siglos. En un momento en el que en nuestro país se ridiculiza la diversidad y se reescribe la historia estadounidense, necesitamos más que nunca estar en contacto con la fe y la esperanza que llevaron a los afroamericanos a superar años de opresión y lucha. Espero que las canciones que hemos estado cantando en la misa durante este mes nos ayuden a apreciar la rica tradición musical de nuestros hermanos y hermanas en la fe y nos inspiren a renovar nuestro compromiso de poner fin al racismo, que sigue siendo tan destructivo para la unidad de nuestra Iglesia, nuestra nación y nuestro mundo. Consideren unirse al Comité de Justicia Racial este domingo por la noche (22 de febrero a las 6:30 p.m.) para ver la película *Hidden in Plain Sight: The History of Black Catholics in Boston* (*Ocultos a plena vista: la historia de los católicos negros en Boston*). La película, de 30 minutos de duración, irá seguida de una conversación y una cena ligera.

Una nota sobre nuestra postura común durante la liturgia: varias personas me han preguntado cuándo deben sentarse todos después de la procesión de la comunión. ¿Está bien sentarse aunque todavía se esté cantando el canto de comunión? Mi sugerencia es seguir el ejemplo del celebrante. Cuando el sacerdote se sienta en la sede, significa que la procesión de la comunión ha terminado, que todos han recibido la comunión y que las hostias consagradas restantes se han colocado en el sagrario. Recordemos que la razón por la que nos esforzamos por mantener una postura común durante toda la liturgia es que, a través de la celebración de la Eucaristía, nos convertimos juntos en el único Cuerpo de Cristo. Como dice San Agustín: “nos convertimos en lo que recibimos”. Nuestra postura común (de pie y cantando) durante toda la procesión de la comunión y nuestra oración (sentados) después de que todos hayan recibido la comunión, nos ayudan a recordar que “al participar del Cuerpo y la Sangre de Cristo, somos reunidos en uno por el Espíritu Santo” [Plegaria Eucarística n.º 2].

Letter from the Pastor

Dear Friends in the Lord,

I'd like to thank all our cantors, choirs, and musicians who have worked so hard during this Black History Month to lead us in prayer with songs from the musical tradition of enslaved African Americans. The Negro Spirituals which have been part of our liturgies during the month of February honor the history of oppression, struggle, faith, and achievement which Black Americans have experienced over many centuries. At a time in our country when diversity is being derided and American history is being rewritten, we need more than ever to be in touch with the faith and hope that carried African Americans through years of oppression and struggle. I hope that the songs we have been singing at Mass this month help us to appreciate the rich musical tradition of our Black brothers and sisters in faith and inspire us to recommit to ending the scourge of racism that is still so destructive to the unity of our church, our nation, and our world. I hope you will consider joining the Racial Justice Committee this Sunday evening (February 22 at 6:30pm) for a screening of the film *Hidden in Plain Sight: The History of Black Catholics in Boston*. The 30-minute film will be followed by a panel discussion and a light supper.

A note on our common posture during liturgy: A number of people have asked me when all should be seated after the communion procession. Is it okay to sit even if the communion song is still being sung? My suggestion is to follow the lead of the presider. When the priest sits down in the presider's chair, that means that the communion procession is complete—all have received communion, and the remaining consecrated hosts have been placed in the tabernacle. Remember that the reason we are striving for common posture throughout the liturgy is that through the celebration of Eucharist we are together becoming the one Body of Christ. As St. Augustine says, “we become what we receive.” Our common posture (standing and singing) during the whole communion procession, and our common reflective prayer (seated) after everyone has received communion help us to remember that “partaking in the Body and Blood of Christ, we are gathered into one by the Holy Spirit.” [Eucharistic Prayer #2]

Green Team Corner: *Recipes for a Greener Lent*

Red Lentil Soup with Veggies and Aromatics

Genesis 25:29-34 tells the story of how Jacob was making some pottage of red lentils when Esau, his brother, arrived home famished. Jacob said that he'd give him the stew if Esau, under oath, sold his birthright to him. Esau said: "I am on the point of dying. What good is the right as a firstborn to me?" And thus, Esau sold his birthright to Jacob for a bowl of lentil soup.

In the Hebrew biblical tradition, soup made of lentils was eaten during a time of mourning. During Lent, as we meditate on Jesus' *Via Dolorosa*, we may mourn his suffering. Adopting this Lenten practice can also help us eat in a more sustainable way, choosing a lentil soup as an alternative to red meat and being kind to our Common Home. If we were Scouts, we'd earn a badge of merit for sustainability!


