


Welcome to St. Ignatius of Loyola

SACRAMENTS

Anointing of the Sick is a source of spiritual strength for those who are seriously ill. It is administered at special Masses during the year and in the homes or hospital of those who are sick, facing surgery, or may be approaching death. Contact Sr. Diane Vallerio, 617-552-6107, vallerio@bc.edu.

Infant Baptisms are celebrated communally one Saturday a month at 11 a.m. First time parents are expected to attend a Baptismal Preparation held on a prior Saturday. Marriage is celebrated throughout the year. Parishioners, BC/Jesuit Alumni, and others are welcome. Arrangements must be made at least six months in advance. Contact: Parish Office, 617-552-6102 or ignatius@bc.edu.

FAITH FORMATION

Programs are available in English and Spanish for children and youth from Pre-K through High School. Our program includes formal classes, sacramental preparation, retreats, service projects, and social gatherings.

First Reconciliation and **First Eucharist** are generally for children in grade two who are either participants in our Faith Formation classes or attend Catholic schools.

Confirmation preparation takes place during ninth and tenth grades. Students attending Catholic High Schools join the program in grade ten.

Community Connections celebrates our community by organizing various parish events. Volunteers are welcome. Help is always needed.

Counters meet on Monday mornings to get the weekend collection ready for deposit. It is a once or twice a month commitment. It is a great opportunity for anyone retired or a stay-at-home parent.

Finance Commission advises the pastor on the parish budget and other business matters.

Funerals and Bereavement is a ministry of presence, in which parishioners serve at funerals. We also offer a program of caring for those who have experienced the loss of a loved one.

Liturgy Commission requires a wide variety of ministers: lectors, eucharistic ministers, bread bakers, and hospitality ministers.

Men's Spiritual Growth meets to help men develop a deeper prayer and spiritual life.

Music Ministry enriches our liturgies with a variety of choirs and ensembles. We offer participants in this ministry a wide range of musical styles and different levels of time commitment.

Outreach Ministries reaches out to support those who live with poverty, hunger, homelessness and suffering. There are a wide variety of service opportunities.

Parish Pastoral Commission is our leadership body involved in ensuring our parish's mission through strategic planning.

Peace, Justice & Reconciliation Commission educates and helps to inspire the parish community to take action according to the Catholic Church's social justice teaching.

Seniors gather for social and other events throughout the year.

Spiritual Life provides opportunities to enrich the prayer and spiritual lives of our community in the Ignatian tradition. Various prayer experiences, programs, and retreats are offered.
